

Claremont Lead Abatement Grants

UVHFH has granted Mary Thomas and Jon Nelson & Berkley Heath the two final \$10,000 Claremont lead abatement grants.

Jon & Berkley used their \$10,000 grant as the match requirement for Sullivan County's HUD Lead Based Hazard Reduction Grant Paint Program, ultimately receiving \$51,000 from the County to abate lead at their 1885 duplex. Since starting in June, Berkley & Jon (who is a lead abatement contractor), have removed lead from the first floor. Now that the space they worked on has passed the preliminary clearance from the lead inspector and been cleared of lead hazards, the next steps are for the

couple to restore the windows and put the interior space back together. They will shift their focus to abating lead upstairs this winter, and then begin on the outside of the home in the spring. Jon reports that receiving lead abatement equipment from the grant has allowed them work on similar projects, thereby having a "multiplier effect."

Mary's lead abatement project will start in late September. These projects are possible thanks to a \$30,000 gift from the Jack and Dorothy Byrne Foundation.

Lebanon Build Scheduled for Spring 2022

Despite the recent record-breaking increases in construction materials and labor costs, coupled with supply chain disruptions and delays for all building-related supplies due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we plan to break ground on a new home on a lot we own in Lebanon in Spring 2022.

As OSB jumped from \$9 to \$64 per sheet and an 8-foot long 2"x4" increased from \$1.75 - \$2.50 to nearly \$10, our Board decided to delay the groundbreaking of the Sargeant-Goodrich home to Spring 2022, when building material prices may be more affordable.
