## Greetings!

Despite the pandemic, I am happy to report that Upper Valley Habitat families, volunteers, programs and projects are thriving and to share some significant updates with you since last month:

With your help, we have nearly finished the exterior work on the Chin's Lebanon home renovation project, which included replacing deteriorated outside trim; repairing the drip edge and replacing rotted fascia boards with PVC; and painting the exterior of the home.

As of November 17, we are suspending indoor work with volunteers due to increasing COVID concerns. We will continue outdoor projects with volunteers as long as the weather allows.

Our Executive Committee (President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary) will evaluate this directive on a monthly basis. In the meantime, those within the organization who are certified through Habitat International to be solo or supervising on site may continue interior work on the home individually on separate days.

The interior work will include adding additional cellulose insulation in the attic to achieve R-80; air sealing the main level and basement with AeroBarrier treatment to reduce energy use; installing a balanced ventilation system (including a Heat Recovery Ventilator, which will reduce moisture and distribute warm air throughout the home); repairing Sheetrock around the ductwork; replacing kitchen countertops; and upgrading light fixtures to LED.

Preliminary site work for the new high-performance home we will break ground on in the spring begins this fall and last week, our Board approved a family of three to purchase this home! We are delighted for the family and cannot wait to introduce them to you soon!

We received several strong Claremont Lead Removal Grant applications from qualifying households with incomes under 80% AMI and are **reviewing those applications currently.** 

The Dartmouth College student Habitat chapter received their official club recognition, after a reboot initiative led by board member Emily D'Iorio. This designation gives students access to Dartmouth resources, funding and transportation, which has long been an obstacle to getting students to the build site. We welcome the Dartmouth Club to the Habitat family!

As we transition into a cold and dark time of year where we won't be able to spend as much time outside comfortably (including with friends and family) and we seek more refuge and solace in our homes, I hope we can all keep in mind and heart those who, even here in the Upper Valley, are struggling to find security, comfort, safety, and peace of mind in their living situations.
